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Publications and Reviews

For the purpose of the organization of the resume, <u>list year of publication first</u>, then follow by these formats.

Article about artist or mentioning artist:

Author of article (last name, first name). "Title of Article." *Magazine or newspaper name*. Date or volume. Page #.

Example: Pryor, Shania. "Subtle or Loud." *Her Magazine*. March 2008. pp 20-24. (Note: If no author is listed, then begin with article title.)

Book:

Author of article (last name, first name). *Title of Book*. Place of publication: Publisher, Year of publication. Page #.

Example: Devante, Cheryl. *Humanity*. New York, NY: Thompson Press, 2009. pp 208-209. (Note: If book is entirely about the artist, then do not list page numbers.)

Digital article:

Author of article (last name, first name). "Title of Article." *Website or archive name.* Date or volume. File type (if unknown file type, write "Digital file").

Example: Mazda, Greg. "Interview with Jenny Johnson." *Specialty Art.* May 2008. PDF file. (Note: If no author is listed, then begin with article title.)

Reproduction of an artwork:

Title of Artwork. Year artwork was made. Magazine or newspaper name. Date or volume of publication. Page #.

Example: Sunset on a Hill. 2004. Artists of our School. Volume 3:2. p 109.

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
